Homeless, abused, and neglected animals face serious challenges in their struggle for humane treatment from us. We are their voice. As we face the challenges of a depressed economy, our voice must be stronger. With our first e-news letter, we are pleased to present our new enhanced web site. The site serves as a foundation of information that will continue to grow in volume over time. Through us the silent voices of suffering animals will be heard loudly through the strength of our message and mission.
